

Mount Mitoku is a mountain once inhabited by practitioners of Shugendo, a form of mountain asceticism combining elements of Buddhism, Shintō



The dark rear side of the Kannon-dō Hall is likened to the mother's womb, and as such signifies rebirth upon climbing the mountain.

## Monju-dō and Jizō-dō Halls

According to tradition, the breathtaking panoramic view from the Halls purifies one's sense of sight. Circumambulating the Halls is further believed to bring the visitor the three virtues of Mount Mitoku (wealth, knowledge, and long life).

## **National Treasure** Nageire-dō Hall

Visitors are amazed and astonished by the overwhelming presence of the Nageire-dō Hall. Once you arrive here, it is said that you have purified the six roots of perception at Mount Mitoku.
